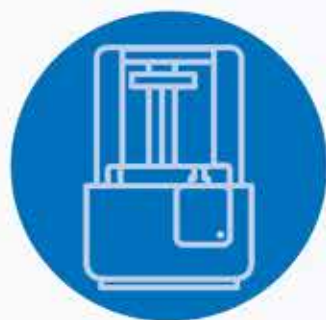

designed unit can accommodate a wide variety of beakers, baskets and instrument cassettes.

In booth No. 403, Biolase is displaying the industry's first laser designed for dental hygiene procedures. The Epic Hygiene Diode laser is expected to receive FDA clearance by year end. Give it a test drive here in New York and receive a free scarf. Buy one and get a *hotels.com* gift card and Away carry-on luggage.

In Septodont's booth (No. 3219), you can check out the Dentapen, a new generation of powered injector. The device, which fits in the palm of your hand, has no cords, no console, nor any long tubing. According to the company, it's actually smaller and lighter than many traditional syringes, and it enables dentists to deliver slow, consistent injections that reduce patient discomfort and pain.

In booth Nos. 1813, 2012, 4307, Designs for Vision is here with its IR Series HDi headlights that feature touch-free operation to eliminate cross contamination. They're available in "WireLess" and corded designs.

Other new products include the Trios 4 Move + intraoral scanner from 3Shape (booth No. 2626) and the first laser curing light for the everyday dentist, the Monet, from AMD Lasers (booth No. 900). At Ansell (booth No. 4904), you can learn more about gloves with Soft White Nitrile TQ-601,

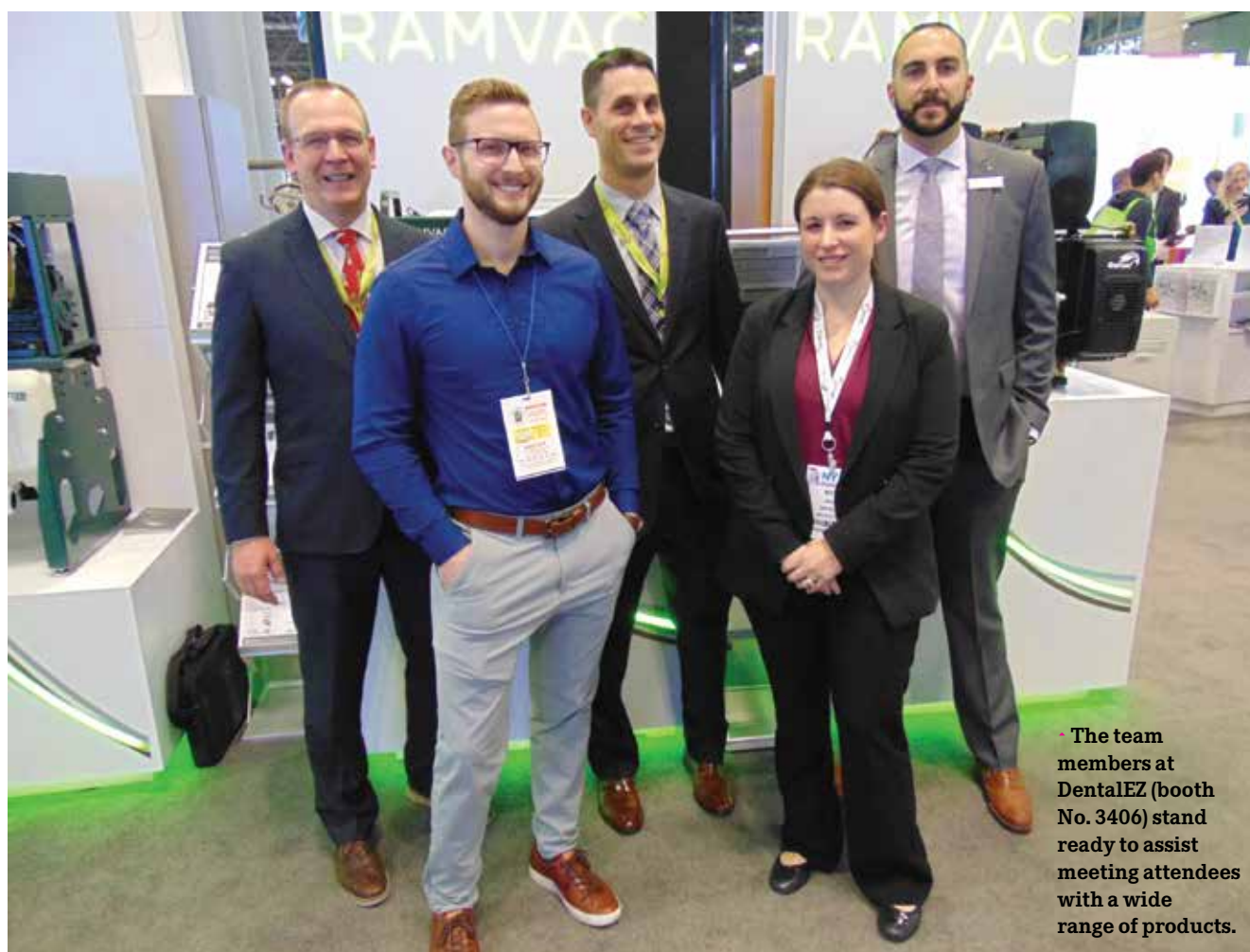

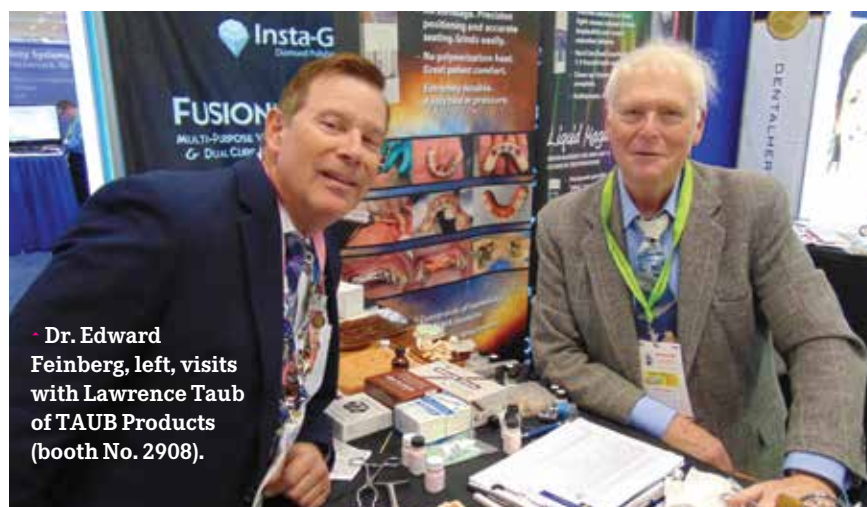

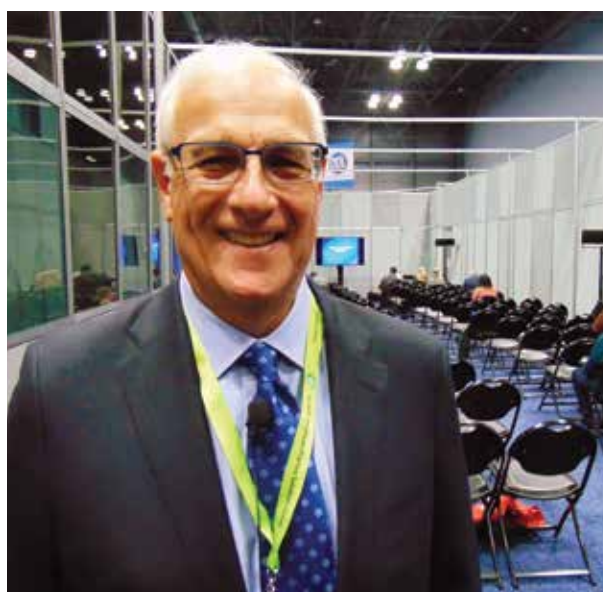
