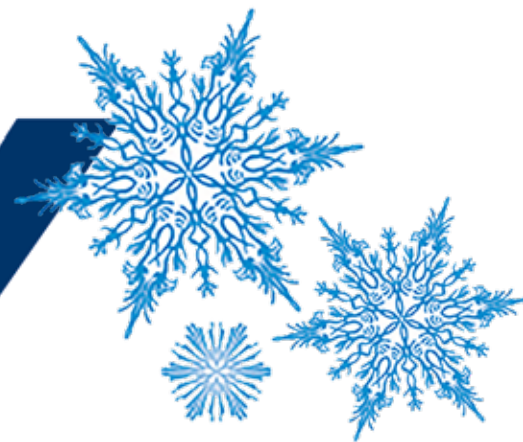

■ It may be winter, but things are heating up in Chicago as the Chicago Dental Society Midwinter Meeting kicks off today. The three-day event is taking place in the heart of the Windy City at the McCormick Plaza West from now through Saturday.

Marking its 158th year, the CDS Midwinter Meeting will showcase more than 140 speakers and offer more than 240 different programs covering a wide range of topics within the dentistry field.

■ The American Dental Association Foundation has announced the 21st year of its Give Kids A Smile (GKAS) program, which officially launched at a national kick-off event in St. Louis, Mo., where the program first began.

Since its national launch in 2003, GKAS volunteers have provided free oral health education and services to more than 7 million underserved children in the United States.

In 2023, nearly 1,200 GKAS events are scheduled to take place throughout the United States, and it is estimated that approximately 300,000 underserved children will receive free oral health education, screenings and preventive and restorative services, such as cleanings and fillings.

These services will be provided by approximately 30,000 dentists and dental team members who volunteer at local GKAS events, using essential oral health care products donated by national sponsor, Colgate-Palmolive,

as well as Henry Schein and its supplier partners.

"What began as a grassroots effort in St. Louis has become a national movement to ensure access to quality oral health care for all children," said Dr. Craig Armstrong, chair, American Dental Association Foundation. "The success of GKAS would not be possible without dental professionals who volunteer at local events each year in addition to national sponsors, Henry Schein and Colgate. My sincere appre-

ciation and thanks to all who have been a part of the program, some from the very first day. We are all involved for the right reason – to Give Kids A Smile and help children in need."

Team Schein has also donated thousands of hours preparing and sending more than 40,000 dental kits to ensure volunteers had the supplies to deliver much needed oral health care.

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Help keep mercury out of wastewater

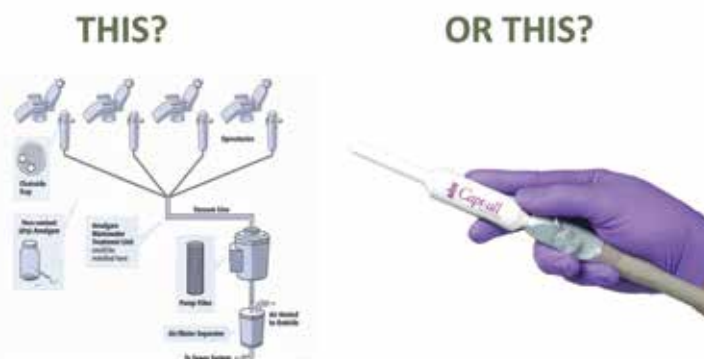
■ Dental amalgams have been a concern for many years because of the mercury content and fear that mercury would enter our water systems from dental clinics.

High volume evacuation (HVE) valves are used in amalgam procedures both in implanting and extracting amalgams. These HVE valves and their disposable tips capture and suck amalgams from the patient's mouth, down the vacuum lines and ultimately into the wastewater system.

The solution to capturing these amalgams for the last 20 years was to place an amalgam separator at the collection point for all the vacuum lines coming from all the dental operatories in a dental clinic just before exiting into the public wastewater stream. This was the basis for many states requiring dentists to insert amalgam separators in their clinics to minimize the mercury contaminating our water systems.

Capt-all, a late addition, approached the issue from what is

inherently the best solution for capturing dental amalgams before they enter the public wastewater system — an HVE tip to contain a filter that captures the amalgam directly from the point of source, the patient's mouth.

Once the procedure is complete, the Capt-all tip is removed from the HVE valve and deposited into a provided recycle container.

This is in contrast to the amalgam

separator clinic where amalgams are sucked down the vacuum line with 70 percent captured in the chairside trap (according to EPA studies) and the remaining 30 percent finally ending up in the amalgam separator.

In addition, and more importantly, as mercury sits in the chairside trap, pump filter and amalgam separator sometimes for months, some of the mercury will dissolve and leach

through the amalgam separator into the wastewater system. This can't happen with Capt-all since the amalgam is captured at point of source, deposited into a recycle container and doesn't enter the vacuum system.

In measuring the mercury content leaving both amalgam separator and Capt-all clinics, one study measured 31.86 mg/liter entering the wastewater system from the amalgam separator clinic while the Capt-all mercury content in the wastewater met consumer drinking standards, i.e. less than 0.0020 mg/liter.

Capt-all is an example of why the EPA added the equivalent capture device that brings new technology to prevent mercury from entering our wastewater systems. Capt-all is compliant with the EPA final ruling per 40 CFR 441.30 (a) (2).

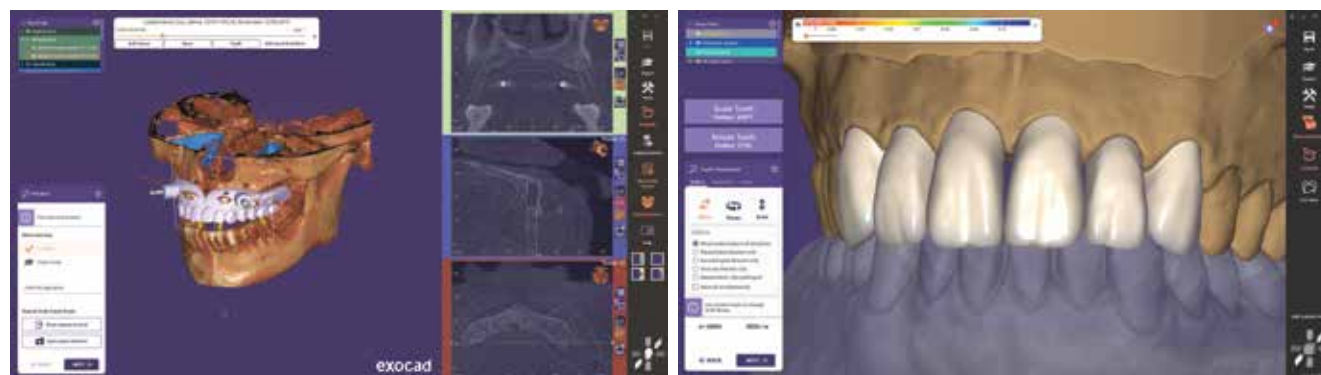
