AAP ready to go live

If you're looking to catch up on your periodontology education, Miami Beach, Fla., is the place to be from Nov. 4 to 7 (Thursday to Sunday), when, after two years, the American Academy of Periodontology will once again meet in person.

The AAP's 107th Annual Meeting, which will take place at the Miami Beach Convention Center, will offer plenty of opportunities for meeting attendees to learn, share and network with the best and the brightest in the field of periodontology.

During the event, attendees can earn up to 22 C.E. credits in various formats, in-

cluding case studies, point-counterpoint sessions, symposiums, lectures and hands-on workshops. A Speaker Studio features live, one-on-one Q&As with seasoned experts in a casual setting. There's also a special perio-systemic general session honoring the late Dr. Robert J. Genco.

The meeting will officially kick off Friday morning with Dr. James G. Wilson's President's Address, followed by the Opening General Session, "When Bad Things Happen to Good Tissue."

A return to an in-person meeting also means the return of the Annual Meeting Exhibition, taking place inside Exhibit Halls A and B. More than 300 exhibitors

Back in the New York groove

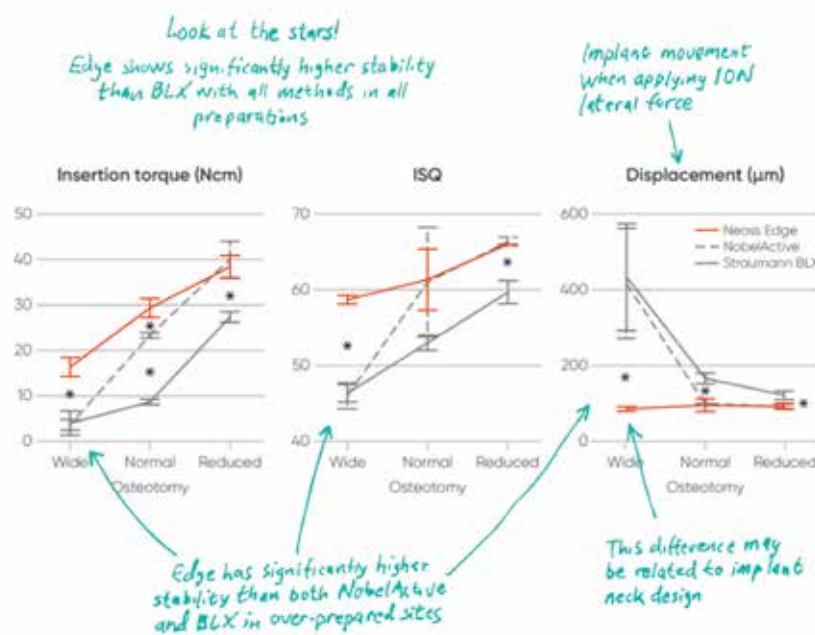
