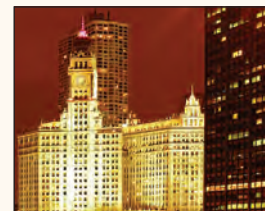

Regroup, retreat, re-energize

ADA annual meeting will be in the heart of Waikiki

Dental professionals attending the American Dental Association annual meeting in Honolulu, Oct. 18-22, will be just a few blocks away from some of the most popular beaches on Waikiki Bay, including Kuhio Beach Park, Kahanamoku Beach and Ala Moana Beach Park.

The Hawaii Convention Center and many of the official ADA hotels are just steps away from the gentle shoreline that downtown Honolulu is known for.

But it's not just the thought of toes in the sand and wading into a calm surf that has dental professionals planning their days in Hawaii. The meeting's array of C.E. courses, seminars and workshops are the big draw. And just as enticing is the opportunity to touch, feel and compare thousands of instruments and other offerings from the dental industry's top companies and organizations, many of whom will be featuring discounts and other convention specials on dentistry's latest innovations and must-have basic supplies.

The meeting's three days of exhibits will be from Oct. 18-20 (Thursday-Saturday) at the Hawaii Convention Center's exhibit hall.

New dentists will be able to spend time with fellow new dentists at the New Dentist Reception, Oct. 19, from 5-6:30 p.m., where they can connect, mingle and expand their network in a fun environment.

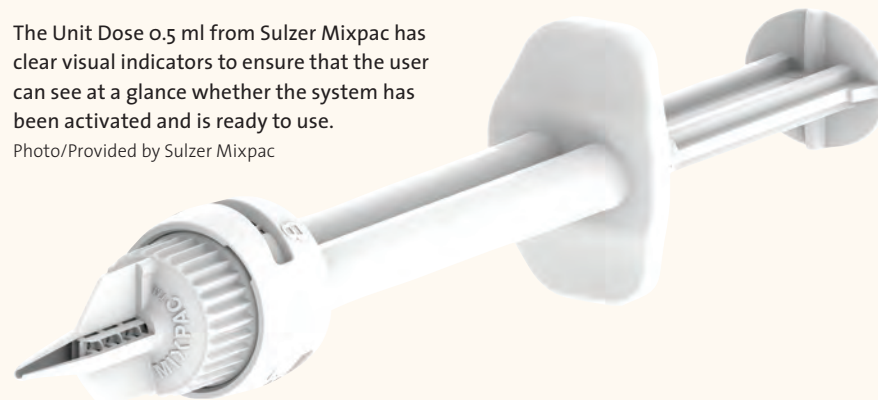

AAE Foundation is honored

Operatory in Philadelphia is part of ongoing outreach

The Foundation for Endodontics received the 2018 Shils Fund Special Recognition Award at the Union League in Philadelphia in honor of its outreach program and support of Project Home. One of only two such awards granted annually by the Shils Entrepreneurial Fund, this tribute acknowledges the foundation's efforts to serve low-income patients who might otherwise face tooth extraction.

Mary T. Pettiette, DDS, president of the Board of Trustees, accepted the award on behalf of the foundation.

"The Foundation for Endodontics is honored that we have been selected to receive the prestigious 2018 Shils Fund Special Recognition Award," Pettiette said. "One focus of our mission is providing access to endodontic care to underserved patients. We hope that the success

of this first domestic program will lead to many others, supporting our efforts to help patients retain their natural teeth."

The foundation opened its endodontics operatory at north Philadelphia's Stephen Klein Wellness Center, operated by Project Home, in April, in keeping with its mission expansion in 2016 to include access to care and following the success of a similar international project in Jamaica. The operatory is staffed by endodontic residents and faculty members from Einstein's I.B. Bender Division of Endodontics, Department of Dental Medicine, including Dr. Louis Rossman, Philadelphia endodontist and past president of the Foundation for Endodontics.

"The dream of the foundation is to save natural teeth, treat infections and restore self-esteem by providing access to root ca-

nal treatment for patients who otherwise would lose their teeth and suffer the pain and social consequences," Rossman said.

As with the outreach program in Jamaica, the operatory in Philadelphia provides free root canal treatment to uninsured, low-income and homeless patients, educating them on the importance of good dental care and what is possible to save their teeth.

"I'd like to thank our individual and corporate supporters for their generous contributions, which help make foundation projects like these a reality," Pettiette said. "In particular, Carl Zeiss Meditec Inc., Brasseler and Henry Schein Inc., for making endodontic equipment available for use in the operatory."

The AAE Foundation, headquartered in Chicago and incorporated in 1966, is the philan-

thropic arm of the American Association of Endodontists. As a 501(c)(3) charity organization, it is to support endodontics by providing resources and funding for research, education, public awareness and access to care. Hargreaves is recipient of ADA Gold Medal Award

Endodontic educator and Journal of Endodontics Editor in Chief Dr. Kenneth M. Hargreaves has been awarded the ADA's Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Dental Research. According to the American Association of Endodontists, Hargreaves' accomplishments have had a profound effect on the endodontic specialty. As a prolific researcher, Hargreaves' focus areas — pain management and regenerative endodontics — are changing the way endodontists treat patients and introducing cutting-edge treatments that not too long ago were not even possible.

The Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Dental Research is sponsored by the American Dental Association together with Church & Dwight Co. Established in 1985 and presented every three years, the award honors individuals who, through basic or clinical research, have contributed to the advancement of the profession of dentistry or to major improvement in the oral health of the public.

The Gold Medal Award recipient receives a \$25,000 honorarium, a gold medallion and the opportunity to serve

a three-year term as a member of the ADA's Council on Scientific Affairs. Hargreaves will be recognized with the honor on Oct. 18, during a ceremony at ADA 2018 in Honolulu.

"Dr. Hargreaves is among the most well-known and respected endodontists in the country and a much sought-after speaker, drawing standing-room-only crowds at lectures around the world," said AAE President Dr. Patrick E. Taylor. "A diligent steward of the AAE's scientific journal, Dr. Hargreaves leads the Journal of Endodontics with extraordinary skill, managing a tremendous workload with great care and efficiency."

As a dedicated educator, Hargreaves has served as chair of the department of endodontics at University of Texas Health Science Center for more than 20 years, molding UTHSC San Antonio into a leading endodontic and research institution.

Throughout his career, Hargreaves has edited five textbooks, contributed to 33 textbook chapters and published nearly 400 papers, abstracts, reviews and editorials. With more than 13,000 citations of

his papers in Scopus, he is one of the most prolific and influential authors and researchers in the history of endodontics. His research has received funding of more than \$95 million from sources that include the National Institutes of Health, the Foundation for Endodontics and the Department of Defense.

According to the AAE, Hargreaves' research on pain management not only is changing the way we manage patients' pre- and post-treatment pain but also influencing pain management in other areas of medicine. As a result, clinicians are able to rely less on opioids, a step in

addressing overprescribing and addiction, the AAE said.

Hargreaves is a leading researcher in regenerative endodontics, currently managing a \$1.7 million multi-center clinical trial to study regeneration of pulp-dentin development in teeth with necrotic pulps and immature roots. Recently, UTHSC San Antonio learned it will receive a five-year, \$24 million research grant from the NIH for its Clinical and Translational Science Award Program, which helps to speed the translation of research discovery into improved patient care. Hargreaves is one of the grant's co-principal investigators.

"I can think of no one who more embodies the spirit of the Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Dental Research than Dr. Ken Hargreaves," Taylor said. 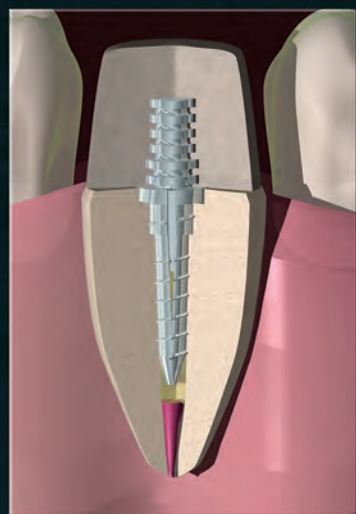
