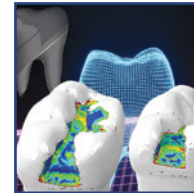

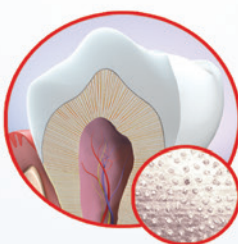

each child received not just dental care but a genuinely supportive experience tailored to their unique needs.

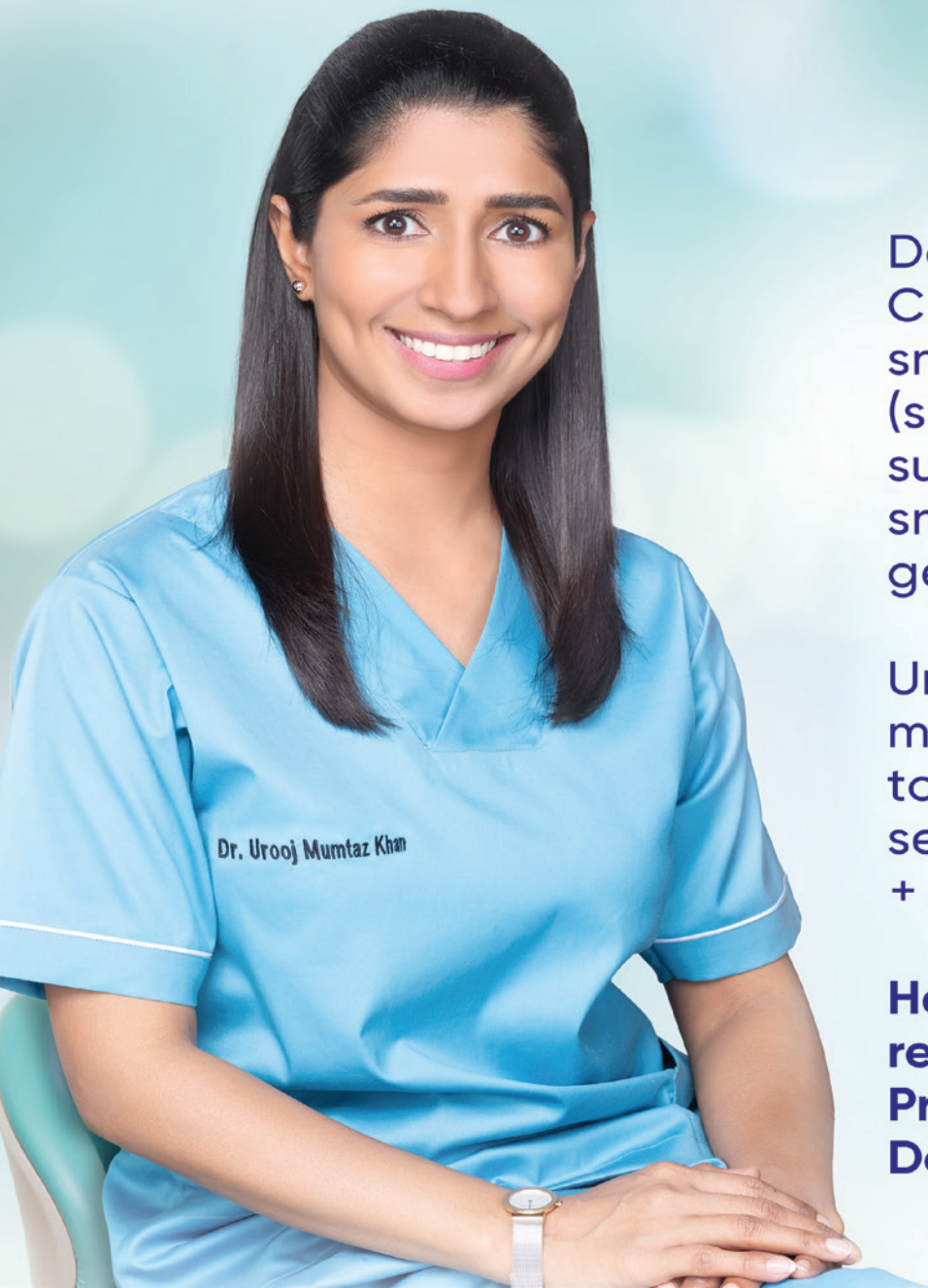

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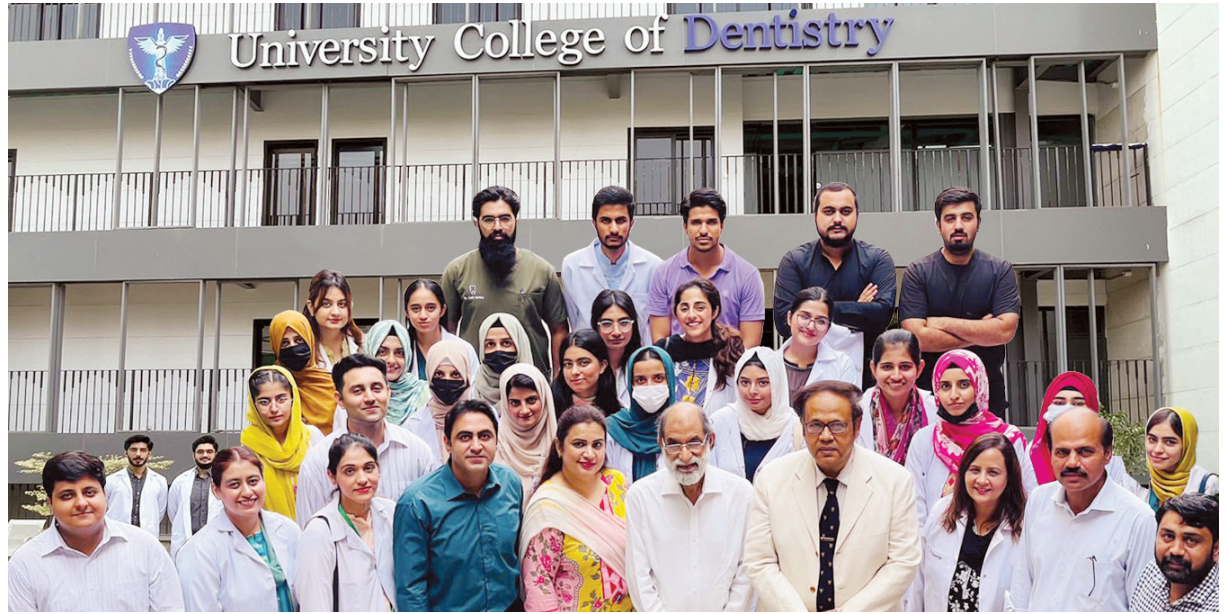
UCMD team holds oral health camps at 20 schools in Lahore
