Doctors face wrath for protesting against PMC

DT Pakistan Report

LAHORE - Police had recently used batons against the doctors, raising their voices against the National Licensing Exam (NLE) in Lahore as clashes broke out when they decided to enter the examination centre.

In light of this situation, the Pakistan Medical Commission (PMC) cancelled the exam scheduled in Lahore at Saphirre Hall and rescheduled it for 29 August 2021.

Some policemen fell to the ground as a result of the clash. Doctors were protesting against the NLE, which has been made mandatory by the government.

According to the reports, all graduates who are currently doing house jobs or ready for it must clear the NLE exam for their permanent registration. Both MBBS and BDS students must clear the NLE for their permanent job and medical practice in Pakistan. The move has encountered opposition from the medical fraternity.

Meanwhile, PML-N President Shehbaz Sharif condemned the action by police to disperse protesting doctors. He said that the use of batons and tear gas on doctors was regrettable. He regretted that doctors are fighting coronavirus while the government was fighting doctors. The PML-N leader said, "Every citizen who raises his voice against oppression is being baton-charged by the government."

Pakistan is now part of WHO's Solidarity PLUS trial

ISLAMABAD - Pakistan has recently joined the Solidarity Plus clinical trials led by World Health Organization (WHO). The trial would evaluate the three drugs for the treatment of COVID-19 infections.

The trial aimed to protect people from severe hospitalization and death because of COVID-19. The selected drugs, i.e. Artesunate, Imatinib and Infliximab, by the panel of experts have proven effectiveness in treating other life-threatening diseases. Artesunate is used for severe malaria, imatinib for specific cancers, and infliximab for immune system diseases, such as Crohn's disease and Rheumatoid arthritis.

The other six countries in WHO's Eastern Mediterranean Region with Pakistan were also enrolled in this trial. Researchers and scientists from these countries, i.e., Egypt, the Islamic

Republic of Iran, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Pakistan and Saudi Arabia, are joining thousands of other researchers from 52 countries worldwide in this study. It has made

Solidarity PLUS the largest global collaboration on COVID-19 research and development.

The collaboration of this sort allows the trial to assess multiple treatments simultaneously using a single protocol, recruiting thousands of patients to generate robust estimates on the effect a drug may have on mortality-even moderate effects.

The Solidarity PLUS trial also allows new treatments to be added and ineffective treatments to be dropped throughout its course. Previously, four drugs were evaluated by the trial. The results showed that remdesivir, hydroxychloroquine, lopinavir and interferon had little or no effect on hospitalized patients with COVID-19.

Govt charges for booster shots to travel abroad

ISLAMABAD - The Ministry of National Health Services (NHS) has recently decided to promote the foreign travel of people jabbed with the Chinese vaccine by permitting them for booster shots with charges. The NHS fixed cost of Rs 1270 for each booster dose. It has been available for those not able to travel abroad due to being vaccinated with Chinese vaccines.

Many countries, including the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, have mandated British and American vaccines for travellers.

Earlier, Saudi Arabia had added the Chinese vaccines Sinopharm and Sinovac to its approved list of vaccines, including Oxford-AstraZeneca, Pfizer/ BioNTech, Johnson and Johnson, and Moderna. However, it was made clear that those who received Chinese vaccine shots would have to get a booster shot of one of the previously approved British/ American vaccines.

The NHS took this decision despite the health experts' concerns about the impact of mix-and-match vaccines on public health.

The criminals shot her in the chest when she showed resistance to the demand for car keys. Later, the doctor died at the hospital.

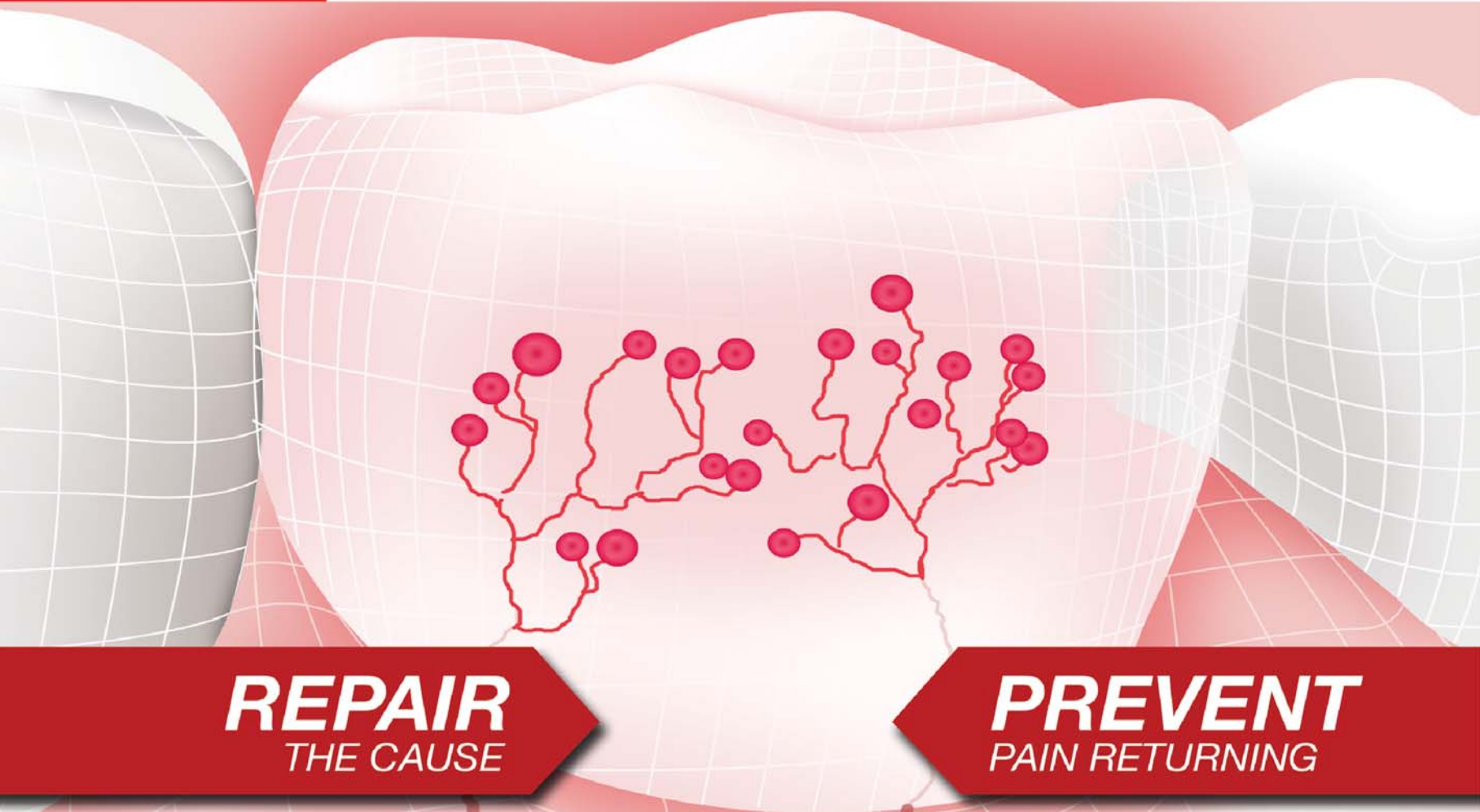

What motivated you to join dentistry?

Well, to be honest, it was more of a fate than a choice but alhamdulillah enjoying it passionately. I always wanted to be a doctor as I wanted to help others and wanted to make a difference in their lives by any means. I got admission to MBBS first, but meanwhile, when I was waiting for the revised lists, I joined de Montmorency College of Dentistry in transition, and it became my destiny very quickly.

I was touched when I saw patients being treated and, in return showing their affection in the form of prayers. Dentistry, I think, is a profession in which if you can treat the patient successfully, the pain goes right away, and the patient is relieved. Apart



from this, I would like to mention another reason the first lecture by respected Dr Nazia Yazdani (Prosthodontist) was a real motivation. She immensely helped me to decide about my future.

You are currently doing PhD in Medical Education from University Ambrosiana. Can you share with us about your research and what have you found?

Yes, after doing my first Master's in Dental Materials from the Queen Mary University of London, I went on to do my second master's in Health Professions Education from Maastricht University and finally got enrolled in my PhD in Health Professions Education (Medical Education) at the University Ambrosiana, Italy. I am almost about to finish my PhD Insha Allah in few months.

In my dissertation, I have done a curricular innovation by introducing a module, Behavioral management, Leadership and Patient safety (BeLP), at the undergraduate level (3rd Year) right from the start of the clinical rotations of undergraduate students. I am in the process of collecting data right now. Still, from the initial findings, it is interesting that if these important domains are taught in a structured manner to the undergraduate students, it greatly impacts their transformation from traditional learners and practitioners to lifelong learners and critical thinkers. It also enhances their knowledge, skills and attitudes, especially when it comes to pediatric patients, patients with disabilities and so-called difficult patients. I would share more Insha Allah once I am done with it.

How much has research played a part in the uplifting of your dental career?

Research has been a great tool for professional development in any profession. In dentistry, it has multiple benefits as it allows the individual to think critically and allows the dentist to develop a deeper

Dr Yawar Hayat Khan is an extraordinary dental professional who has made his mark in dentistry, both in Pakistan and abroad. He is Vice-Principal and Head of Department of Dental Materials, Assistant Dean of Department of Medical Education, Medical Administrator and Chief Proctor at the Riphah International University, Islamabad.

Dr Yawar completed his BDS from de'Montmorency College of Dentistry, Lahore, in 1999. He, later on, went to England to pursue his postgraduation, Master of Sciences (MSc.) in Dental Materials from the Queen Mary University of London. In 2012, Dr Yawar completed Masters in Health Professions Education from Maastricht University with flying colours.

Dr Yawar's extraordinary professional résumé includes his services as Director Centre of Excellence in Leadership, Innovation & Quality (CLIQ) and Member Advisory Board Curriculum Committee & Program Coordinator (MSLDE) at Ras Al Khaimah College of Dental Sciences (RAKCODS), Ras Al Khaimah, UAE. He is also appointed as the Director of the Academy of Leadership Sciences (ALSS), Switzerland.

In recognition of more than 19 years of experience in teaching and management, Dr Yawar has also been awarded the International TMA Certified Professional and Membership of Asia Pacific Biomedical Science Educators Association (APBSEA), Singapore. He is also a member of Harvard Business Review (HBR), Advisory Council, USA. Dr Yawar is also an Ambassador at the International Association of Medical Science Educators (IAMSE), Pakistan, California, USA.

understanding of the biosocial underpinnings of the profession. It has certainly helped me a lot as well and being a clinician, it has given me a good vision of how to correlate the clinical findings with the best evidence-based practices.

As you have studied dental materials, do you foresee any new materials being developed shortly? Well, as we speak, there are continuous developments in the dynamic field of dental materials. The technologies being introduced into dentistry enable greater precision, productivity and time savings than methods from generations past. They also enable clinicians to undertake new procedures, develop new materials and accomplish their goals in innovative ways.

Ever since the development of composites in the

1960s and the introduction of CAD/CAM in the 1980s, has there been such an exciting time of innovation in dentistry. Researchers, manufacturers, scientists and practitioners are welcoming new and emerging technologies from 3D printing and self-healing teeth to non-chemical disinfectants and digital scanning, all of which have the potential to transform in meaningful ways how dentistry is practised.

In your opinion, do you think any material will become obsolete shortly? If one student wants to pursue dental materials, what is to be expected?

It can be hard to keep up with emerging technologies and innovations in the healthcare world. One particular material I would like to mention in this context is the silver fillings. Silver fillings are quite misleadingly named since they consist of about 50% mercury. The World Health Organization (WHO) says that 53% of the mercury emissions found in our environment are due to these fillings and other laboratory devices.

In dentistry, the filling material is called amalgam. Although there are conflicting reports on how safe its use is in dentistry, there's simply no reason to continue using it. Resin, tooth-coloured material is widely available for fillings and possesses better and safer physical properties without the danger of a toxic substance. Many dentists are so concerned about the potential toxic vapours constantly emitted from amalgam fillings that they remove and replace them with safer and esthetically pleasant materials.

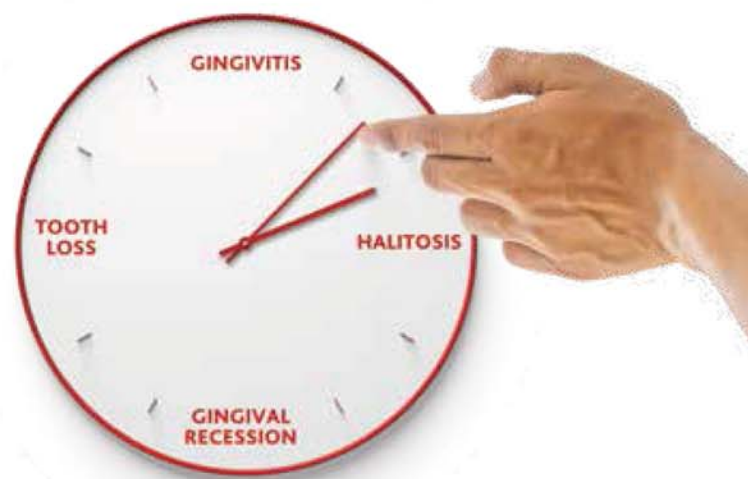

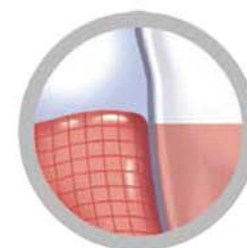

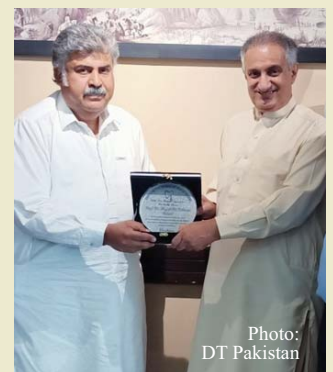
