43rd APDC Pakistan, a resounding success

KARACHI - The virtual 43rd Asia Pacific Dental Congress (APDC) was successfully hosted by Pakistan under the aegis of the Pakistan Dental Association (PDA). The PDA, led by Dr Mahmood Shah, the new president-elect APDF, had been working

The conference's inaugural session started with the Holy Quran recitation, followed by National Anthem. The incoming president, Dr Mahmood Shah, took the oath of office administered by Dr Suresh, who followed his speech.

PMDC Bill 2022 passed

DT Pakistan Report

ISLAMABAD - The National Assembly has recently passed the Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PMDC) Bill 2022 in a joint session.

Sponsored by PPP lawmakers, including Mahreen Razzaq Bhutto and Syed Agha Rafiullah, the House passed the PMDC Bill 2022. Moreover, the government also approved the decision not to take MDCAT and NLE from medical and dental students. The House also passed the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences (PIMS) Bill, 2022, which was sponsored by Syed Agha Rafiullah.

Upon the commencement of the Pakistan Medical & Dental Council (PMDC) Act, 2022, the existing Commission constituted under section 4 of the Pakistan Medical Commission Act, 2020 shall be dissolved. The Minister in charge of the Division shall manage the Council's affairs until the constitution of a new council under this Act and until a new president, and a vice-president is elected. During an interim time, the Minister in charge of the Division will have Council authority.

Abdul Qadir Patel, Minister for National Health Services, Regulations, and Coordination,



commended the National Assembly for repealing two controversial acts approved by Pakistan's previous Tehreek-e-Insaf government (PTI).

He said the repeal of two black laws, the Pakistan Medical Commission and the PIMS Act, was a positive step while speaking on the point of order in the National Assembly. Over 55 per cent of Sindh medical college seats remained unfilled as a result of the PMC Act 2020. While over 18,000 students decided to pursue medical education abroad since the Pakistan Institute of Medical Sciences was established as a private corporation under the PIMS Act. With the government's consent, he said, several favourites were paid Rs 1 million, Rs 2 million,

and Rs 800,000 in salary. He stated that the current government was concentrated on demonstrating performance and giving the best possible amenities to the people. The Pakistan Medical and Dental Council (PMDC) was abolished by an ordinance issued by Dr Arif Alvi, Former President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, paving the way for the foundation of a new organisation, the Pakistan Medical Commission (PMC).

A total of 220 council employees were told to leave the office for a week by the NHS Ministry of National Health Services (NHS), which took control of the PMDC building through the Islamabad district administration and police.

DRAP suspends registration of three drugs

DT Pakistan Report

ISLAMABAD - The Drug Regulatory Authority of Pakistan (DRAP) recently suspended the registration of three drug items for failing to meet safety, efficacy, and

quality requirements (SEQ).

Sajid Hussain Shah, the spokesperson of DRAP, said that the Board of DRAP has suspended the registration of these drug products, including painkiller tablets of Diclofenac Potassium in strengths of 75 & 100 mg, a liquid suspension of anti-ulcer drug Famotidine in strengths of 10mg/5ml and 40mg/5ml, and a combination drug product containing paracetamol, thioridazine and caffeine over lack of safety data.

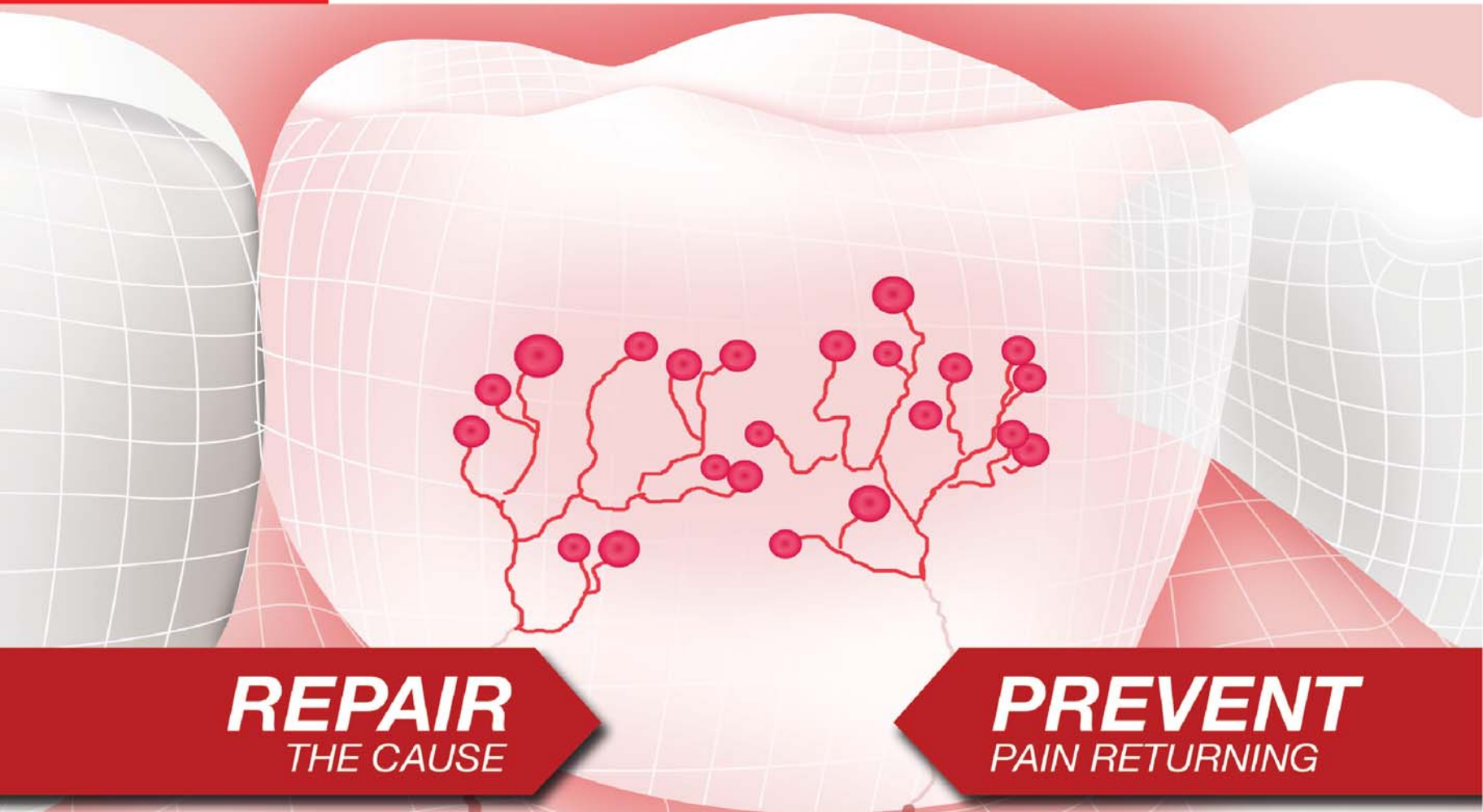
Because there is very little data on the quality, safety, and efficacy of these pharmaceutical products, DRAP advised healthcare professionals, patients, and their attendants not to prescribe or use them. The statutory board of DRAP to register, suspend, or cancel drug registrations decided to suspend all registrations of these drugs after an extensive deliberation on the results of the benefit-risk evaluation and providing an opportunity for personal hearing to manufacturers holding registrations of these drugs.

The DRAP Registration Board evaluated the profiles of these drug

products based on quality, safety, and efficacy criteria according to The Drugs Act of 1976. The panel, which is made up of experts in medicine, pharmaceuticals, and pharmacology, made the decision to suspend the products based on reports from the US Food and Drug Administration (USFDA), the Medicine and Health Product Regulatory Authority (MHRA) in the United Kingdom, Health Canada, and Swiss Medic in Switzerland. Furthermore, no pharmacovigilance (PV) data on these formulations' adverse drug reactions (ADRs) is available.

Pak academicians publish Oral Biology book

Exclusive Report

KARACHI - Pakistani academic duo made homeland proud by writing an Oral Biology book titled "An Illustrated Guide to Oral Histology" to address the challenges in understanding the concepts of Oral Histology. The WILEY Publishers, UK, have published the book. Dr Imran Farooq and Dr Saqib Ali are alumni of Baqai Dental College, Baqai Medical University, Karachi, Pakistan (BDS, Graduated 2006, and 2008) and Queen Mary University of London, U.K (MSc Oral Biology 2011).

Imran and Saqib have 10+ years of experience in teaching Oral Biology to dental undergraduate and postgraduate students.

They have published 100+ and 60+ research papers and book chapters

that have received 1000+ and 500+ citations, respectively. Their passion for teaching and learning had led them to create a 9-chapter book in collaboration with Prof. Paul Anderson from the Queen Mary University of London, UK, that outlines the histology and pathology of oral tissues and their clinical significance.

The textbook contains high-definition histological images of oral tissues with integrated text on its introduction, key identifying histological features, and clinical considerations. There is a companion website for the book as well. In an exclusive talk with the Dental Tribune Pakistan, they said,

"Our teaching passion has led us to create a 9 chapter book that outlines the histology and pathology of oral tissues and their clinical significance. The idea for a book

focused on critical elements of oral histological features arose about two years ago when we saw several gaps in the existing literature on the subject. This book provides information on these aspects in an easy-to-understand way. It includes integrated text with high-definition (HD) histological photographs of oral tissues, as well as an introduction, key identifying histological features, and clinical importance. The textbook is aimed at dentistry students in undergraduate and postgraduate programmes, as well as licensure exam candidates and oral histology instructors.

We were both working full-time when we started on this book, so we had to cram writing and editing into late nights and weekends. We got the sensation throughout the process that we were accomplishing something

fantastic and that this book will be valuable to the readers. Writing a book taught us a lot about patience, drafting, and the craft of writing. In retrospect, we are very proud that we wrote this book published by WILEY (a global publishing giant). Writing and editing a book isn't easy, but it's also not impossible. It is possible to achieve with the correct amount of determination and collaboration, and the results could be fruitful."

The workshop was a part of the IADSR 8th Professional Diploma in Advanced General dentistry (PDAGD). Dr Saqib Qazi facilitated it.

Dr Saqib initiated the workshop by describing the importance of direct composites in general practice to the participants. Problems that result from polymerization shrinkage, differentiation between polymerization stress and polymerization shrinkage, and the effect of polymerization stress on adhesion were taught to the participants. The facilitator also elaborated on the role of an inorganic filler and organic matrix in developing the properties of composites.

Dr Saqib thoroughly explained the classification of composites, micro-mechanical

flowable bulk-fill composite was performed.

Dr Qazi also discussed strategies for minimizing polymerization stress and shrinkage, slow start polymerization technique, optimal requirements for shade selection and the importance of appropriate use of light curing techniques.

The facilitator enthusiastically answered the queries raised by the participants. Participants performed the bulk-fill technique, incremental build-up based on calculating the C-factor for each increment. They operated the curing light using a slow start polymerization technique. Lastly, treatment planning was discussed in-depth, and the facilitator gave valuable suggestions. -PR

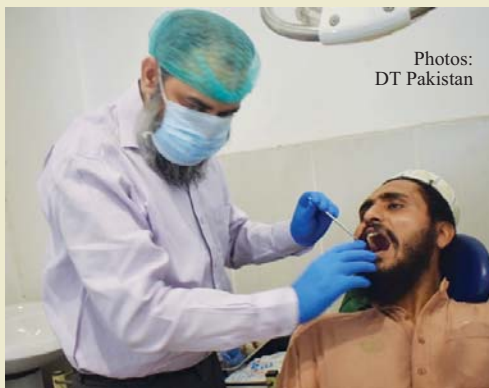

AIMI enables vision-impaired to learn about their oral health

ABBOTTABAD - Abbottabad International Medical Institute (AIMI) recently conducted a general and oral health preventive program at Light House School for Blind Girls.

AIMI, with the collaboration of Abbottonians Medical Association®, took this initiative to address special needs children to fulfil their "General & Oral Health" needs and initiated a preventive program for these populations in Abbottabad.

of the 30 girls in "Light House School for Blind Girls" was performed by medical and dental specialists.

Oral health education was given to all blind students using the "Tell, Feel, Do" technique.

Gypsum made models were used to feel the carious lesions and calculus on tooth surfaces. Tooth brushing techniques and oral hygiene instructions were taught by dentists to each blind girl in school individually.

Each girl's medical and dental record
